What a fantasticl and successful year it's been for Lakes de. We've had really good attendances at our Wednesday runs, averaging 26 hashers per week, including 72 visitors from overseas, interstate and local hash clubs. A few of the visitors even decided to stay and are now regular runners.

Some very special runs for the year included, Christmas in July, the LH3 1800th, Mothball's 70th, Cooch's 60th, Astro's 69th, the Christmas Party at Kangaroo Ground, the combined H3 run arranged by Bionic & MH3 and our 34th Anniversary run. Lakesiders also attended other club's AGPU's, the 50th Anniversary of Hash in Hobart, the back to Nash Hash in Ballarat and Interhash in Fiji.

One of the really enjoyable attributes of Lakeside runs is the nosh - not only with special runs, but also with some of the regular runs set from homes or parks - when hares often put in that extra bit of effort to produce delicious and memorable meals. SECRETARY'S REPORT

Lakeside Hash House Harriers has been an Incorporated Association with Consumer Affairs Victoria (CAV) since 1992. Small organisations such as ours, which operate for the benefit of the members, but which do not intend to make a profit or engage in trade, can register as an incorporated associa-

tion. This means that members and office holders are protected against personal liability for the organisation's debts. A hash club could acquire a debt if, say, a visitor was injured on a run and sued the club. If a court found the club to be negligent, any damages would be limited to whatever was in the club bank account, but this protection would be contingent upon us meeting our CAV obligations.

Over the years, Lakeside has been a bit slack keeping our CAV registration up to date. Sometimes Annual Reports are submitted many months after the due date. Committee members change at every AGPU, people become ill, change jobs or travel overseas so it's easy for CAV obligations to be overlooked. Previously it was not always clear whose job it was to liaise with CAV or lodge annual reports.

Upon becoming GM, Kokup asked me if I would take on a newly created governance position of Lakeside Secretary for three years. The Secretary is not a Lakeside Committee member, but is an official position described in the CAV legislation. The Secretary's job is to lodge the annual CAV statement, including annual financial statements; to advise CAV of changes to contact or address details; and to ensure the association rules and membership lists are current. A three year tenure was suggested to get around the inevitable 'Committee churn' which always occurs following the AGPU. The on-going Secretary can advise the in-coming GM and ensure the new Committee continues to meet its CAV obligations.

Kokup and Gargoyle spent considerable time sorting our 2017 balance sheet and preparing our most recent financial statements while LuBangOz and Cheesecake updated our CAV details. From now on, CAV things will go smoothly... I promise.
